Energy & Housing Assistance

(Income Guidelines Apply)



Home Weatherization helps to reduce heating and energy costs by improving the energy efficiency of homes and apartments.

LIHEAP provides emergency help for low-income families in paying utility bills.

EAGR provides minor home improvement at no cost to people who are disabled and require assistance to make their rental unit more accessible (available only in rural communities).

Housing Assistance is available to CSET participants who are low-income and reside in Tulare County.

Senior Home Repair provides minor home repairs for adults over 55 or disabled living within Visalia city limits.

Microenterprise

The Tulare County Microenterprise Program offers technical assistance, financing, training, microenterprise loans, and business services centers. Business services are free of charge to assist entrepreneurs to grow or start businesses. **Pre-Venture** classes cover the basics of running a successful microenterprise and help participants determine if a small business is a viable option for them. Income guidelines apply. Classes available in Spanish and English.

Workforce Development

On-the-Job Training

Eligible participants learn new job skills while working and earning a living. Employers can save money and train their own way by participating in this program.

There is no reason for age to be a barrier to continued employment. Let us be your career coach if you are 55 years plus. We provide retraining opportunities.

Women Without Limits

If you are a woman who enjoys working with your hands, solving technical problems or working outdoors, a non-traditional career may be right for you.

Adult Career Transitions (ACT)

Individuals receiving cash aid can develop job skills through a variety of workshops, find and retain full-time employment, and become self supporting. We have a variety of resources to help provide extra support including resume writing, work experience and coaching.

Veterans Services

CSET's Veterans Services program provides information on benefits, assistance in obtaining benefits, services such as job placement, on-the-job training and workshops, and referrals. For more information, call CSET and ask for the Veterans Services Advisor.

Resources for Businesses & Job Seekers

Businesses can benefit from our recruitment, screening and matching services. On-the-job training can save employers up to 50% on employee salaries. For job seekers, a variety of workshops, employment videos, books, resume help and much more are available. Eligibility guidelines apply for some services.

1976

Self-Help Enterprises (SHE) "spins off" Self-Help Training and Employment to provide youth employment training and rural community services. First chairman of the Board: Joe Friedman.



1986

CSET creates the Tulare County Youth Corps to serve young people who want to continue their education and prepare for work.

1994

CSET joins pro-youth collaborative to begin renewal of community action in North Visalia at family and neighborhood levels.



1997

Wellness Foundation funds Goshen Planning Council. CSET creates Community Initiatives Department to target community building. CSET and KCAO submit Empowerment Zone II application.

2000

CSET funded to operate Gang Violence Reduction Project with partners Probation and Sheriff, Ivanhoe Youth Center, and Tulare County Housing Authority.

2005

CSET moves into new headquarters, built in part by a State Park Bond; first building in the City's North Visalia Community Campus.

CSET starts Electronic Recycling program, processing 377 tons of E-waste in its first year.

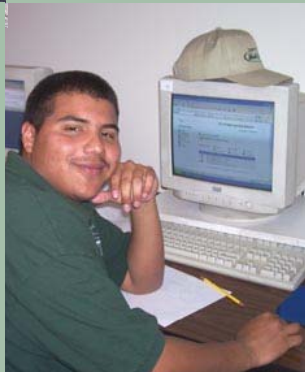

John Muir Charter School established to provide young adults with job training while completing their education.



Youth Services

Work Experience

CSET provides youth and workforce development services: Skills training, alternative secondary schools, paid and unpaid work experience, occupational skills training, citizenship and leadership development and much more. This program is funded by the Tulare County Workforce Investment Board.



Gang Prevention

Gang prevention instruction is provided to youth, parents, community groups and school faculty. Youth gain positive alternatives to gang activity as well as tools for understanding gang mentality. Parents and teachers learn to identify gang affiliation and prevention strategies.

Junior Leadership

This activity-based leadership development program relies on the belief that youth learn by doing. The curriculum is designed to be highly interactive and flexible to foster the creativity and full participation of youth. In our community-based setting, Jr. Leaders set college and career goals and gain the skills to take on leadership roles in their communities today and in the future.

Tulare County Youth Corps
