Job & Resource Fair by the Sequoia Community Corps, June 24th Recruiting Corpsmembers To Join the Sequoia Community Corps

[Tulare County, CA] CSET's Sequoia Community Corps (SCC) is proud to host a job and resource fair on June 24th from 10 AM to 1 PM outside at the CSET Main Office (312 N.W. 3rd Ave. Visalia). This free event will provide an overview of paid job training opportunities through the Corps. Additionally, on-site interviews will be conducted for those interested in becoming a Sequoia Community Corpsmember. Information about CSET services and essential resources will be provided, including rental and energy assistance, free diaper distribution, recycling education, employment services, CalFresh program, SafeLink Free Wireless Service, COVID-19 in the Workplace Education, COVID-19 Vaccines, and more.

"We are excited about meeting new Corpsmembers at this recruitment event," shared Teresa Guzman, SCC Division Director. "The SCC is an essential conservation program in Tulare and Kings Counties providing young people and adults the opportunity to develop job skills and work experience in the green industry. The Corps journey provides opportunities to explore environmental careers, expand personal growth, and make an impact in the community."

For the past 34 years, the SCC has successfully operated in Tulare and Kings Counties, providing more than 4,000 young adults with valuable job training, educational opportunities, leadership, and environmental awareness through community conservation projects. It offers paid training opportunities in weatherization, urban greening, construction, conservation education, and CRV beverage container recycling (i.e., e-waste, used oil, waste tires). Projects entail park development, environment beautification, recycling collection services, weatherization of homes, and natural resource conservation in local community areas. Various positions are available starting at \$14.00 an hour.

The SCC is among the California statewide network of state-certified community Conservation Corps addressing critical community needs. Established partners include CalRecycle, Urban Tree Foundation, Caltrans, City of Visalia, City of Porterville, City of Dinuba, and other local municipalities.
